Introduction to regulatory decision-making and adjudication

1. *Is there any minimum qualification that is defined for the members?*

It depends on the committee. For instance, only members with post-secondary teaching experience are qualified for the Academic Standards Committee. Only members with the CHRE designation are eligible for the CHRE Review Committee. Members on the Appeal Committee, the Capacity Committee, the Complaints Committee, the Discipline Committee, the Review Committee and the Registration Committee are required to have a CHRL or CHRE. The Continuing Professional Development Committee requires that member have either the CHRP, CHRL, or CHRE. The Experience Assessment Committee requires that members have the CHRL designation.

2. *Where can we get list of current committee members and for what duration members will be on the committee?*

The committee rosters are not made public. Most professional regulatory bodies do publish this information, however. This is something we are looking into.

3. *In the event of insolvency of a firm, what exactly would the HRPA investigate?*

The Act requires the Review Committee to review all notices of bankruptcy and insolvency events. The mandate of the Review Committee is to determine whether the member or firm's bankruptcy or insolvency event may pose a risk of harm to any person. The investigation would be in regards to this determination.

4. *Committee members compensated?*

No they are not. All expenses incurred by committee members are reimbursed as per HRPAs Expense policy.

5. *Can HRPAs members read decisions made by any of the Committees? Publishing decisions will educate HRPAs members in terms of what is appropriate or not.*

Yes. Any decisions that are made pursuant to a hearing are public. This would apply to decisions of the Discipline Committee, the decisions of the Review Committee when a hearing was conducted, and the decisions of the Appeal Committee when reviewing a decision which was made pursuant to a hearing. These decisions will be published on the HRPAs web site and summaries will be published in the Regulatory Affairs newsletter. One thing that some regulators have begun to publish summaries of Complaint Committee decisions but without any identifying information.
